

Online Learning Skills

(UdS-Teaching Assistant and Learning Programme; Module: Learning)

Target groups: students, guest students, tutors from all faculties, all other interested University members

Contents: The range of scientific courses is increasingly moving in an international environment. Students from all over the world can learn and interact with one another in face-to-face, hybrid and e-learning courses. In this workshop we would like to give students and tutors the opportunity to use digital tools in online, hybrid and blended learning seminars to learn and teach individually or collaboratively. You will get to know digital tools that facilitate online learning, promote cooperation and focus in a target-oriented manner.

Individual seminar, programme, certificate: For a full and committed visit to an individual event in the modules “Teaching Assistant” and “Learning”, you will receive a proof of competence-based participation from the University Didactics Unit at SU (AS HD). This workshop can be incorporated into the teaching assistant and learning certificate building on the basic workshops. You can book the workshop as a single event independently of the teaching assistant and learning certificate. Participants from 10 AE combined with a written performance can complete CPs regardless of the certificate.

Recognition of the CPs: The workshop, the programme and the certificate are recognized in the Bachelor's optional area. For other courses of study, ask your examination office whether the CPs are recognized. These are individual decisions by the examination offices.
