Selection criteria/Score system	Academic Performance – 30p English Language Competency – 30p Motivation – 20p CV – 15p +5p for first time participants Applicants receiving at least 50% of each criterion are eligible for selection. The

	student(s) with the highest total score are
	approved; students with results of 60 or more
	are put in the reserve list and the remaining
	applications are rejected. The results are
	disseminated amongst the applicants and 3
	days are given for appeal. A person outside of
	original evaluation committee reviews the
	appeals and the final results are approved by
	the Rector.

Procedure	The recognition at the University of Georgia is
	managed by the Credit Recognition
	Department within the Study Process
	Management office of UG with cooperation of
	the head and representatives of the
	appropriate study program in accordance
	with the credit recognition rules set out by the
	National Center of Educational Quality
	Enhancement of Georgia. The compatibility of
	the learning results achieved within the
	framework of another educational program is
	determined based on the analysis of the
	student's passed component syllabi (field
	and general competencies corresponding to
	the learning goals and results) and/or on the
	basis of the exam. The commission is
	authorized to require the student to pass the
	exam if, based on the analysis of the syllabus,
	the compatibility of the study results cannot
	be determined. The decision on the
	recognition of credits is made based on the
	analysis of learning goals and results
	provided by the syllabus.

The decision of the commission can be
appealed once to the rector in accordance
with the law.

Procedure	For the staff mobility, the academic and
	administrative staff are required to prepare
	an oral and written report on their mobility
	period to the Academic Council of the
	University of Georgia. The participant staff
	members present the process of the mobility
	as well as results – acquired skills,
	knowledge, information, contacts – and
	suggestions for institution's, faculty's or
	study program's further development.
