Working hours are flexible and the work is done remotely, meetings take place online. You have to be located in Germany. You will be paid on the student assistant (HiWi, "wissenschaftliche Hilfskraft") pay-scale of Saarland University. Benefits include getting hands-on experience in creating linguistic resources and partaking in a multi-authored paper describing the efforts by the treebank builders.
